

Grammy Award winner Hank Williams Jr. is gearing to launch a 2013 summer tour in celebration of his latest album, Old School, New Rules. Cities among the concert lineup include Detroit, Orlando, Atlantic City, Biloxi and many more. Known for his powerfully charged performances and trademark style, Hank will take the stage with a string of hits along with new tunes that showcase his distinctive vocals and extraordinary musicianship.

"I always have fun playing shows. I love to get out in front of my loyal fans and making my mark on this great country," says Hank Williams Jr

Hits for the country superstar include "Family Tradition", "Whiskey Bent and Hell Bound", "Old Habits", "All My Rowdy Friends Are Coming Over Tonight," "A Country Boy Can Survive" and "Red, White & Pink-Slip Blues" and more. ABOUT HANK WILLIAMS JR:

Williams has no doubt had a long and successful career and continues to make sparks in the industry. In October 1982, Williams had nine albums on the Billboard music charts at the same time, a feat unequaled by any other living artist. Hank has received 16 songwriting honors from Broadcast Music, Inc., had 10 #1 singles, 13 #1 albums, 20 gold and five platinum albums and a double platinum (Greatest Hits, Vol. I). In 1987, Hank won the first of five straight Entertainer of the Year awards voted to him by his peers, and won his first ever Grammy. As a touring artist, Hank was a pioneer in bringing arena rock production values to country music, and he remains one of the most consistent ticket sellers in music, period, as generation after generation gets turned on to one of the most dynamic live performers ever to take the stage.

The Homeplace CD by Bobby Cyrus is a slice of country music heaven. Bobby's powerful vocals compliment the well-crafted lyrics - seven of which he had a hand in writing. Tom T. Hall ("A Rose For Marie") and Billy Ray Cyrus ("Milkman's Eyes") add memorable moments, but Bobby really shines on songs like "Carved Our Names In Stone" and "Send Me Wings." "Homeplace" a recitation by Bobby's father ends this very personal CD.

Andy Joe Stewart's A Little Love CD is a refreshing breeze of West Coast country music. Although his background in Los Angeles is not so country, he delivers each of these ten songs with vocal ease and believability. From the uptempo "Sweet Darlin" to the heartfelt and emotional "Turn The Radio On," this project is a pleaser from start to finish.

Don McNatt wrote/co-wrote all but one of the twelve songs included on his CD, Have Songs, Will Travel. There is certainly an assortment of material from the opening bluesy song, "Singing A Song" to the humorous, "Ripped Up Tore Up." Don even includes a Christmas song, "Tomorrow It's Going To Be Christmas." Don approaches each song with enthusiasm and conveys the varied styles with precision.

Keith Pearson's CD, The Bluegrass Collection, is ten songs of bluegrass pleasure. From "Bluegrass Lullaby" to "Talkin' To The Lord," Keith's rendition is on the mark with each and every number. It is obvious that Keith is at home musically and the instrumental, "Vladivostok Two Step" is a lively piece that is quite entertaining.





Gordon Wilcox • Break The News

Gordon Wilcox's Break The News CD is a stroll down the traditional country music memory lane. There's enough steel guitar, dobro, and fiddle to make any traditionalist tap their toes. Gordon begins the album with "Single Yellow Rose," delivering it with honesty and sincerity. He ends the project with the country gospel tune, "Jesus Don't Turn Me Away." A nice collection dedicated to his daughter.

CLAY ALSTON * NASHVILLE BOUND

Louisiana native, Clay Alston is a "real country music" singer and entertainer - adding a certain distinctive flair to a reviving traditional sound. His passion for music began at age 10 when he learned to play the guitar, thus launching his musical journey.

Keith Bradford of KMA Records saw this steadfast traditionalist at a showcase and the two immediately connected. Now on July 1st, KMA is set to release their 5th Clay Alston album entitled Nashville Bound, which Keith also produced. The title cut, "Nashville Bound" Clay conceived on one of his many trips back and forth to Nashville working with Keith and talking with so many other artists chasing their own honky tonk dreams. While the project will

include mostly original material, there are a couple remakes including Waylon Jennings' "Only Daddy That'll Walk The Line" and "Hanging Jail," a regional hit about the "Old Beauregard Parish Jail" in his hometown of DeRidder, Louisiana

Clay's previous album, Those Kinda Thangs, received much acclaim particularly in South Africa where it stayed on the top of the download charts for the entire year of 2012. Ironically, South Africa has one of the largest country music associations in the world and hosts a huge festival in Johannesburg each year. Frans & Cathy Maritz of Wildhorse Entertainment in South Africa introduced Clay to this market and continue to promote country music to their enthusiastic audience.

Although his new album is soon to be released, Clay is already looking ahead, writing more songs and hoping to do a Christmas project soon. He's also on the road, and will be performing shows with the Kentucky Headhunters and Jeff Bates. Clay has come a long way from the nightclubs and barrooms where he used to play and has done it his way - with integrity and pure talent. Once in the 90s, he found himself with the same producer as Mark Chesnutt, Tracy Byrd and Clay Walker, but putting family first, his record deal was not meant to be at that time.



Clay comments, "I always kept my head below the clouds and never let my head get above them." And he lives that statement every day - his fans mean the world to him. Always glad to meet people after a show with a smile and a handshake, he'll spend hours talking and socializing with them like they were old friends.

What's on the horizon for Clay Alston - just more of everything - more writing, more concerts, and more recordings as an eager following awaits!

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Several generations of "Dukes of Hazzard" fans will gather in Nashville, Tennessee on Saturday, June 8th to celebrate "Dukes of Hazzard Fan Fair" with the entire cast of the show. The event, which coincides with the CMA Music Festival, will be centered at Cooter's Place on McGavock Pike, across from the Gaylord Opryland Hotel.

"It's not often that we can all get together like this," says Ben Jones, who played the sidekick mechanic "Cooter" on the ever popular international hit. "But it is a thrill for us and a big kick for the fans when we do!"

John Schneider (Bo), Tom Wopat (Luke), Catherine Bach (Daisy), James Best (Rosco), Sonny Shroyer (Enos) and Rick Hurst (Cletus) will join Jones for the day's events, which will culminate with a Hazzard Hoedown concert at the Nashville Palace featuring the whole cast onstage with Cooter's Garage Band.

"We haven't all been together in Nashville since our DukesFest celebrations in 2006 and 2007. They were the largest fan gatherings for any film or television show ever. One year we had more than 100,000 folks show up at the State Fairgrounds. This festival is intended to be smaller and a little more laid back than that, so hopefully everyone will get all those autographs!"

The Music Valley area around Cooter's Place will host a Hazzard County Car Show, with scores of General Lees, Hazzard Police Cars, Daisy Jeeps, and Boss Hogg's Cadillacs. There will be a Hazzard Youngun's Area with children's activities and lots of things to jump up and down on," Jones adds.


